The giveaway pays tribute to the iconic TV series, written by John Byrne and first broadcast in 1987. It followed the chaotic adventures of a rock 'n' roll band. The show became a cultural milestone, winning six BAFTAs and launching the careers of its star-studded cast, including Robbie Coltrane, Emma Thompson, Maurice Roëves, Richard Wilson and Katy Murphy. Much of the series was filmed on and around Sauchiehall Street, making Glasgow itself a key character in the story. Bell's Pottery was one of the largest and most important of Stoke on Trent's many ceramic manufacturers. They exported all over the world and were very successful in the Far East — and Glasgow! Drawing inspiration from the famous 'willow pattern' found in the original Willow Tearooms, join Make It Glasgow to explore this history through ceramics and making during this hands-on session. Bring your wee ones to make a tile to contribute to a collection, taste some teas from the Mackintosh Tearooms and transport yourself back to Glasgow's tea era! You'll leave with a badge to take home, and your tile will be added to a collection to be included in future displays.

Since then, Italian food culture has been integral to Glasgow. The Italians were leaders in café trade in the West of Scotland in the early 1900s — and were at the forefront of popularising the fish supper! Come along and make your own pizza with Join the Dots artist collective in Garnethill Park, using the community Bread Oven, and celebrate the merging of Italian and Glaswegian culture!		Head up to Garnethill Park for an alternative take on 'park life'. Garnethill Park was created on the site of demolished tenements in 1991. Since then, it has become a favourite spot for residents and visitors, as well as a home and rest stop for our scaly, feathery and furry friends. It also features some rare trees, a pyramid, a pizza oven and some amazing murals. Help create a new sensory artwork, hug a tree to find out how old it is, play the pyramid, indulge in some 'deep listening' and follow your nose to find some interesting historic smells.
